Community Center Reopening—COVID-19

I hope this newsletter finds you well and healthy. During Stay-at -Home order was stricter to our seniors as Older adults and people who have severe underlying medical conditions like heart or lung disease or diabetes seem to be at higher risk for developing more serious complications from COVID-19 illness. Many of you have been isolated for last 4 month.

Town Hall, Community Center, Police & Fire Stations are now open to the public but with certain limitations. In our town buildings we request that you wear a mask unless you have a medical condition plus maintain social distancing. However, we understand that some of you may still be reluctant to enter a Town Hall. Therefore, as we have done throughout the closure, we will continue to have drop off boxes outside of Town hall and be available for appointments, via regular mail, email or electronically.

Here are reopening phases for Atkinson Recreation Senior program at the community center;

Phase 2 – Starts on August 3rd. Establish limited outdoor and Indoor programs and classes.

For On-site INDOOR at Atkinson Community Center – Very limited capacity for offering non-exercises, games such as bingo and other card games.

For OUTDOOR – Exercise classes along with non-exercise classes, games and Exercise classes should be held earlier in the morning to avoid warmer temperature. One 10 x 20 tent is set up outside of Community Center for some shade. Pickleball League will be held at Woodlock Park tennis court. Volunteers needed for organizer.

- All the programs and classes will be limited number of participants where 6 feet of distance can be maintained. Also keep offering virtual classes and social meetings.

Here are what you need to know and to do during the Phase 2:

- Registration is required ahead of time for each class, there will be no drop-in classes.
- All the participants will be taken temperature, screened other CIVOD-19 questions.
- No one with a temperature of 99.9 or above will be admitted in the programs and building.
- COVID-19 screening questions regarding your health and travel will be requested on a written form. A
 record will be kept for contact tracing.
- Entrance to Atkinson Community Center will require a mask. Disposable masks are available in office.
- For indoor Stop at sanitizing station and sanitize hands. Sanitizing station will be set up on the hallway and a
 few other locations.
- Limit non-exercise classes size up to 50 people or less for Banquet room, 5 people or less for Room 1 & 10 people or less for Room 2.
- Exercise Classes will be held outside whenever possible at early mornings.
- Participants will stay in their car until when we are ready to start class signal by the instructor or staff member.
- If use the indoor facility, after each class a staff member will sanitize the doors, chairs, bathroom, and all high touch areas.

- Participants must bring their own water bottle, coffee and other drink.
- Virtual classes might be available for some classes
- No food or beverages will be supplied by Atkinson Community Center...
- Attendees will be directed into the program, then asked to leave promptly through designated door Banquet room use the back door after the program or activity.
- Only one program will be running at a time.
- Allow a half hour between classes to give staff members time to clean

Board of Selectmen will reassess the condition in the end of August.

Phase 3 – Most of the programs and classes will be held INDOOR and optional OUTDOOR programs. TBA.
