May 2024 Trees

With the Conservation Commission turning 50 this year, we've been holding lots of new events and programs in town. The month of May is no different! The members of the Conservation Commission will be walking in the Memorial Day parade and giving away wildflower seeds to the public. We will also be giving away tree seedlings (Red Cedar, White Spruce, Gray Dogwood) to Atkinson residents only over the age of 12yrs (while supplies last).

Why are trees important?

- ★ they make oxygen for us to breathe
- \star their roots stabilize the ground helping to prevent / slow erosion
- ★ their roots clean the groundwater making water safe for us to drink
- ★ they absorb carbon from the atmosphere and store it which help reduce the greenhouse effect and climate change
- \star they create shade to help cool our houses in the summer
- ★ they provide important habitat for many wildlife species
- ★ they're visually appealing (especially in autumn)

Trees aren't the only important plants that provide the above benefits, all plants provide these benefits in one way or another. If you can't plant trees on your property, consider planting native perennials or letting parts of your lawn go unmown because grass also provides these benefits!
