If you wish to participate in the town-wide, curbside Bulk Item Disposal Service, you must submit a form to the Selectmen's Office at 19 Academy Avenue no later than Noon on Wednesday, April 6, 2022. If you have any questions, please call (603) 362-5266.

Town Hall will be open during its normal hours, 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. on Monday to Friday. You can drop off your payment - **only checks & cash** - as well as your Bulk Pick-Up Form to the Selectmen's Office.

For this bulk pick up, the cost is \$33 per item or \$58 per mattress.

Casella will only remove items from private residences that have properly notified the Town and paid the appropriate fee as required.

TOWN CLERK NEWS

It's dog renewal time! All dogs must be licensed in the State of NH per RSA 466:1 annually by April 30th. The Clerk's Office must have a current rabies certificate on file in order to register or renew your dog.

Please see the information in this email regarding the Fire Department Rabies Clinic being held Sunday, April 24th, 11:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. should your dog need an updated rabies vaccine.

Assuming a current rabies certificate is on file with our office, you can renew your dog(s) license(s)

You will be asked to provide your dog's current license tag number. Ex: your dog was issued tag # 210470. You would enter 21-0470.

You can also call or email the Town Clerk's Office and we will look it up for you.

Please notify the Town Clerk's Office of any changes in your dog's status at <u>townclerkoffice@atkinson-nh.gov</u> or call (603) 362-4920.

If you are new to town or recently acquired a new furry family member, you can newly register him/her at that same link above.

If you bought out a leased vehicle, you must visit the Town Clerk's office to transfer the title and registration to your name.
