

MASTER PLAN COMMITTEE NEWS

THE MASTER PLAN UPDATE PROJECT IS UNDERWAY!

The Master Plan Committee (MPC) was formed in July 2022 consisting of Planning Board members and resident volunteers. The Town has engaged Resilience Planning and Design, LLC to assist us though the process. The MPC is a sub-committee of the Planning Board and acts in an advisory capacity and will draft the Master Plan update and present to the Planning Board for a public hearing and adoption according to NH statue.

The MPC will hold public meetings on the 3rd Thursday of each month. The public is always welcome to attend. Agendas and meeting minutes are available on the Town's website on the MPC's page. The public is always welcome to attend these meetings.

Here is a recap of progress so far:

On August 31, 2022 a kick-off meeting was held. The members got acquainted with each other and with the scope of the project. We have started the first 2 tasks, 1) Community Outreach & Engagement and 2) Mapping and Analysis of existing conditions. During the Analysis of current conditions, the MPC will address 2 topics per meeting. Community & Engagement will always be a topic throughout the entire process.

The MPC met again on Wednesday September 21 with the Master Plan consultant, Steve Whitman of Resilience Planning and Design of Plymouth. Although there were only a few items on the agenda there was no shortage of discussion. The items discussed were Outreach and Engagement, Population, Housing and Land Use. There are a number of committee members that have been in the town a long time and they reported how the town has changed and how the town continues to change. Steve was grateful to hear the discussion as this information is vital in forming the process to be used as we move toward the master plan.

Stay tuned for updates on this process, specific ways to share your feedback, and opportunities to create a community vision for the future of Atkinson!

ABSENTEE BALLOTS

As of today, October 1st, we are still awaiting the arrival of our Absentee Ballots. We will mail them out as soon as they arrive to everyone who has submitted a request as of that day.

More Absentee Ballot Information:

- You may vote by using an absentee ballot if you meet the state's requirements and
 qualifications and are unable to vote in person because of disability, religious beliefs,
 military service, or because of temporary absence. COVID-19 is no longer a
 qualification.
- Absentee Ballot Request Form for November 8, 2022 State General Election can be found here: <u>Absentee Ballot Request Application</u>.
- Anyone can pick up or drop off an Absentee Ballot *Request* Application for someone other than themselves.
- The Application Request Application must be signed with a wet ink signature.
 Electronic signatures CANNOT accepted.
- Request forms (once signed manually) can be faxed, emailed, mailed, or dropped off by anyone.
- Absentee Ballots **CANNOT** be handed to anyone but the voter standing in front of us.
- Absentee Ballots cannot be applied for nor returned to the Supervisors of the Checklist at their November 1st meeting.
- Atkinson DOES NOT have a Ward. Please leave that blank on the Affidavit Envelope.
