NEW HAMPSHIRE DROUGHT

Atkinson Board of Selectmen Recommend Residents Limit Outdoor Watering

Concord, NH - According to the U.S. Drought Monitor, over the past two weeks, "moderate drought" conditions have developed across New Hampshire and "significant drought" has developed along most of the state's border with Massachusetts, including Atkinson. The historically observed impacts of these drought designations can also be found on the U.S. Drought Monitor, including information about effects to the environment, agriculture and the public.

A low snowpack this past winter and an early spring melt coupled with below average rainfall over the past few months have contributed to dry conditions. Additionally, over the past 30 days, only 25% to 50% of normal precipitation was received throughout most of the state. These conditions led to a rapid decline in soil moisture, surface water levels, and streamflow, which resulted in the drought declaration. So far, groundwater levels in the southern part of the state are somewhat variable, however, uniform low groundwater levels along the Connecticut Valley have been measured along with very low stream flows in the northeast section of the state.

Drought conditions are likely to persist. Precipitation outlooks indicate that the volume of rain needed to alleviate drought conditions in the next few months is unlikely to materialize. Also, temperature outlooks are signaling a potential for higher-than-normal temperatures, which can exacerbate drought conditions.

water use restrictions, such as **limiting lawn watering to before 8 AM and after** 7 **PM and to odd and even days**. Everyone should be aware of the current drought conditions and take responsibility for limiting their own water use to protect water supplies and home wells.

VIRUS-POSITIVE MOSQUITO TEST RESULTS

The State of New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services (NHDHHS) has detected Jamestown Canyon Virus (JCV) in a mosquito pool submitted for arboviral testing from the town of Atkinson. This was a pool collected on 8/2/2022 by a mosquito management contractor, on behalf of the Town, during their routine Town-wide sampling exercise. Currently the town of Atkinson is at "baseline" Arboviral risk for the season-but resulting from this detection it will be updated to "low," as outlined by NHDHHS.

Per the CDC, Jamestown Canyon virus is spread to people by infected mosquitoes. The virus is found throughout much of the United States, but most cases are reported from the upper Midwest. Cases occur from late spring through mid-fall. Fever, headache, and fatigue are common symptoms with Jamestown Canyon virus disease. Jamestown Canyon virus can cause severe disease, including encephalitis (inflammation of the brain).

The Town of Atkinson recommends citizens and visitors take the following preventative measures as a result of these findings, proposed by NHDHHS during the Town's low-threat of probable illness:

- 1. Repair Screens.
- 2. Dump standing water weekly.
- 3. Wear mosquito repellant when outdoors during peak mosquito hours (from dusk to dawn).
- 4. Wear long sleeves and long pants when outdoors during peak mosquito hours (from dusk to dawn).
- 5. Use mosquito netting on baby carriages and playpens when outdoors.
- 6. Arrange neighborhood clean-ups to get rid of mosquito breeding sites.
- 7. Be aware of stagnant water on property (e.g., unused swimming pools) and consult local health officer.
- 8. Clean roof gutters so that rainwater cannot collect in them.
- 9. Do not attempt to drain or alter natural water bodies such as ponds, marshlands, and wetlands as they are regulated under state law and any alterations may require the approval of state and possibly federal agencies.

DISPOSAL OF PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION

Have you wondered how to safely dispose of prescription medications? A method that is safe for the environment and you can be assured that the medications will be out of your home and you can be free of worry that medications will not be taken without your knowledge? Here are the steps for safe disposal and the resources are right in our town!

The Atkinson PD has a metal drop box in the main lobby. It is open Monday thru Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Anyone can come in and drop off medication (in their bottle). The metal box has a one way handle that drops into the container, so it is completely tamper proof.

From there, the medications are collected and then incinerated. The medications and the bottle! this is fantastic for two important reasons:

- 1. It does not contaminate the ground. It is incorrect to dilute the meds and put in kitty litter or coffee grounds and throw in the trash! Those remains end up in the landfills contaminating the soil and eventually in the water/bodies of water. Despite this method being circulated, it is NOT the correct way to dispose of prescription medications that can be toxic.
- 2. Flushing in the toilet is a no no as well, as it also contaminates the water/septic systems.

Please share this important information with persons who may find themselves in this situation.
